

DIRECTIONS TO THE EVENT VENUE

From I-5 South take exit 258 toward North Salem. Turn right onto Portland Road NE and follow to Sunnyview Road. Turn left onto Sunnyview Road and follow to the venue. You will pass 17th Street and continue a short way. Signs will be posted, and you will turn left into the second driveway and follow past the Amphitheater to Cascade Hall.

From I-5 North take exit 256 toward Silverton. Turn left onto Market Street NE and follow to Evergreen Avenue. Turn right onto Evergreen Avenue and follow to Sunnyview Road. Turn left onto Sunnyview Road and follow a short way by a field. Signs will be posted, and you will turn right into the first driveway and follow past the Amphitheater to Cascade Hall.

ENTRY & PARKING: Entry for sellers, vendors and exhibitors on Friday night and Saturday morning will be through the doors on the west side of the Cascade Hall building, which faces the Jackman Long building. The public will enter through doors on the north side of the building on Saturday. You may park in any of the lots surrounding Cascade Hall, unless there is an event at the Jackman Hall building, in which case we may be restricted to the north and east parking areas. We will notify you prior to the event if there are restrictions, or if a different entry will be utilized for sellers, vendors and exhibitors.

SALES AREA RULES

Following are the rules if you are participating as a seller in the bird sale:

- Setup and check in for birds is Friday, October 27th from 6pm to 8pm, and Saturday,
 October 28th from 7am to 8:30am. The sale
 is open to the public on Saturday
 from9:45am to 4pm. Breakdown may begin
 at 4 pm.
- Full tables are available for \$60 for the entire show day. Only CCC members in good standing may rent table space. All sellers may sell only birds or bird related items.
- Sales tables are not arranged by category.
 Tables are assigned in the order that registrations with payment are received before the sale, or are received at the sale by the Sales Manager, Randi Smith. If you have reserved table space ahead of time, your table space is marked with your name and you may set up immediately.
- Members renting tables are solely responsible for the care and sale of their birds, as well as all funds collected. Sick or injured birds may not be offered for sale and must be removed from the sale table immediately at the request of the Show Manager and/or Sales Manager.
- If a member renting a table wants to participate in other aspects of the show, they may assign another person of their choice to sell their birds or bird related items on their behalf.
- For safety reasons, regular sized cages may not be stacked more than two high. Tall cages may not be stacked. Product may not be stacked beyond a safe and prudent level. In all cases regarding safety, the decision of the Show Manager or Sales Manager is final.

- Birds that may be included in the sale include canaries, finches and other species that are part of the finch and softbill class, and small hookbills. The sale definition of "small hookbill" is birds that are no larger than a cockatiel or kakariki. Larger birds will not be allowed.
- Only birds being offered for sale by members who have rented tables, or birds registered to be judged at the show, will be allowed in the building.

The club price is \$125 + tax per night for a double queens room or a single king sized bed. A pet fee is additional for dogs. The deadline to make reservations is 5 pm on October 6th to get the special club group rate. (Remember that animals other than birds for show or sale (or certified service animals) are NOT allowed into the venue.)
